



Orca Identification

This is a guide to the orca (Orcinus orca - also known as killer whales) who are known to visit Punta Norte, Argentina.

Orca are the largest of the dolphin family and are long-lived (up to 100 years). Each has distinctive marks which make them individually identifiable. The dorsal fin, saddle patches and eye patches are the most commonly used features for identification. Look for the overall size and shape and then more subtle features such as notches in the fin or scars on the saddle patches.

Male & Female Orca

Adult Male: 5-9m / 5,600-9,000 kg (16-30ft/6-10 tons).

Dorsal fin up to 2m (6.5ft).


Adult Female: 4.6-8m/3,800-8000 kg (15-26ft/4-9 tons). Dorsal fin up to 1m (3ft). Can be curved like a dolphin fin. Newborn: 2-2.5m/up to 180kg (6.5-8 ft/up to 400lbs).














Current Orca With No Known Family Association to Ishtar or Maga

Antu is a very proficient hunter who often caught pups for JC. It is possible that JC is Antu's son, and he may also be her last calf as she was not observed with a calf since PNOR began studying the orca in 2004. She was absent between 2018 and 2022 but returned, stranding again in 2022.

This adult male is part of the larger population of orca that live around Peninsula Valdés. He is not known to strand and is typically seen in the Austral spring when the orca are not usually hunting sea lion pups. He is currently the oldest male regularly sighted at Punta Norte.

Mel was a hunter with legendary talents. He was first observed at Punta Norte in 1975 when he was a young adult male. Mel was observed with open wounds on his jaws and distinctive white scaring when the wounds healed. Mel was usually found with Sol, who has not been seen since 2013.



In 1990 Ishtar was stranded on the reef in front of the Punta Norte reserve for five hours. She was kept wet and comforted by the Guardafauna. After this harrowing experience, she was interested and friendly with people. She was a proficient hunter before disappearing in 2010.

This adult male (estimated to be born in 1989), was not a strander. He was typically seen in association with Antu, who would often capture sea lion pups and take them to JC. He was named after Juan-Carlos Lopez, a researcher who studied the orca at Punta Norte in the 1970-1980's.

Mela was born in the Austral winter of 2005. Mela was Jazmin's first known calf. This young orca disappeared in 2010 before its gender was known and before learning to strand.

Sol was first seen at Punta Norte in March 2006. Between 2006 and 2011 she was observed traveling with Mel who hunted and brought her food to share. Mel was observed trying to teach Sol the stranding technique, but she was never seen stranding.

Issy is Maga's third known calf. Issy was occasionally seen coming to the beach during hunting with Maga but was not seen intentionally stranding to hunt. This young orca disappeared in 2010 and is presumed dead.


